




ISPEAR Welcomes New Set of LSG Officers: A Moment of Pride and Promise






USM Partners with OAEPhil to Strengthen Outdoor Adventure

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

UNIVERSITY OF SOUTHERN MINDANAO (USM), a level IV state university created under Republic Act No. 763, Series of 1952, as amended and Presidential Decree No. 1312, Series of 1978 with principal office and postal address at Bai Matabay, Plang Avenue, Poblacion, Kabacan, Cotabato, Philippines, represented herein by its University President, JONALD L. PIMENTEL, Ph.D., hereinafter referred to as "First Party";

and

The INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF PHYSICAL EDUATION AND SPORTS (IAPES), an international organization represented by its President, JESUS D. ARGARIN, Ph.D., with principal office address at Robinson Pioneer, Barangay Ilaya, Mandaluyong City, Metro Manila, Philippines, hereinafter referred to as "Second Party".

Collectively, hereinafter be referred to as the "PARTIES".

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, in recognition of the currently established and positive relationship that has been developed between the PARTIES and in anticipation of the need to further strengthen this partnership in the future, the PARTIES have voluntarily decided to formalize initially the said partnership through the instant instrument;

WHEREAS, while the instant Memorandum of Understanding does not, at this juncture, strictly create binding or legal obligations on either of the PARTIES, it must be underscored that both, through their respective authorized representatives are enjoined to voluntarily ink out the specific details of the terms and conditions reflecting their intended goals and desired objectives in a separate Agreement;

WHEREAS, both PARTIES readily acknowledge the aforesaid noble endeavor for their mutual benefit as well as the respective institutions they represent herein while manifesting their willingness to mutually work together for the achievement of their common objective;

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the foregoing premises, as well as the PARTIES' common interest in promoting the mutual cooperation in the field of education and research, while desiring to enhance their mutual cooperative educational exchange, both PARTIES hereto voluntarily commit to expand and enhance the degree of collaboration, cooperation and partnership between them through the following, to wit:

Article I: Purpose

The main purpose of this **Memorandum of Understanding (MOU)** is to develop mutual cooperation on the basis of equality and reciprocity as well as promote relations and mutual understanding between the **PARTIES**.

Article II: Scope of Cooperation

Both PARTIES hereby voluntarily undertake to promote and develop cooperation through the following; thus:

- Exchange of personnel with relevant expertise for lectures, seminars, discussions, and cultural activities;
- Participate in activities such as conference, workshops, publications and seminars:
- 3. Joint collaboration in the development of programs and learning content;
- 4. Joint research and development in areas of common interests; and
- Cooperate and collaborate in other educational and academic exchanges to which the PARTIES mutually agree.

Article III: Financial Arrangement

Both PARTIES voluntarily and mutually agree that all specific arrangements and plans for activities to be undertaken as stated under the terms of this **Memorandum of Understanding (MOU)** and in such other **Agreements** to be executed later shall be subject to further negotiation, approval and availability of funds.

Article IV: Implementing Agreement

A detailed description of the scope of agreed activities shall be defined clearly in a separate **Agreement**, which constitutes an integral part of this **MOU** including but not limited to the following; thus:

- 1. Elaboration of the responsibilities of each institution for the agreed activities;
- 2. Schedules for specific activities;
- 3. Budget and sources of fund for each activity; and
- 4. Any other items deemed necessary for the efficient management of agreed activities.

Article V: Intellectual Property Rights and Publication

The PARTIES may share, utilize and publish data and information, while respecting patent rights pursuant to existing copyright laws, and other intellectual property rights.

Article VI: Settlement of Differences

The conflicting viewpoints or interpretations of this MOU shall be settled amicably by mutual consultation, arbitration or negotiation with reference to the rules on conflict of laws. It is agreed between the PARTIES that the applicability of this provision relating to choice of law and venue is limited to this MOU only and shall not be considered as a precedent for the binding agreement/s to be entered into by the PARTIES for implementation of one or more of the identified areas of cooperation as specified in this MOU. The choice of law and venue in respect of the binding agreement/s shall be mutually agreed.

Article VII: Amendments, Duration and Termination

- 1. Any amendments to this MOU can only be done by mutual consent of the PARTIES.
- This MOU shall take effect immediately on the date of its execution and shall remain valid for the duration of three (3) years from the date of execution and shall be automatically renewed on an annual basis thereafter, unless terminated or replaced with a new MOU.

3. On justifiable grounds, this MOU may be terminated by either of the PARTIES by written notice at least three (3) months, or ninety (90) days, prior to the intended date of termination. This written notice of termination shall not affect the programs currently underway and these programs shall be allowed to continue until their completion.

ARTICLE VIII: SEPARABILITY CLAUSE

Should any provision or stipulation herein be subsequently declared invalid, unconstitutional by the court of competent jurisdiction with finality, the same shall not affect the validity or legality of the other provisions or stipulations hereof.


